HOLOCAUST CENTER FOR HUMANITY ART OF REMEMBERING: STUDENT ART CONTEST 2024

OFFICIAL RULES

Important: Please read these Official Rules before entering this Contest (the "Contest"). By participating in this Contest, you agree to be bound by these Official Rules and represent that you satisfy all of the eligibility requirements below.

NO PURCHASE IS NECESSARY TO ENTER THIS CONTEST. Contest void where prohibited by law. Subject to applicable federal, state, and local laws.

- 1. Eligibility: The Contest is open only to legal residents of the states of Washington, Idaho, Montana, and Alaska who are 9 to 18 years old at the time of entry, and whose parent or legal guardian agrees that the parent or legal guardian and entrant have each read, understood, and agreed to these Official Rules with the entry, and that such agreement constitutes acceptance of these Official Rules on behalf of the parent or legal guardian and entrant. Directors, officers, members, managers, and employees of Holocaust Center for Humanity ("Sponsor"), and any of their respective parent companies, affiliate companies, subsidiaries, agents, professional advisors, sponsors, advertising, promotional, public relations, and fulfillment agencies, consultants, legal counsel, website providers, web masters, and immediate family members (spouses, parent, child, sibling, grandparent, and "step" child, wherever they may live) of each are not eligible to win any prize. IF YOU DO NOT MEET ANY OF THESE REQUIREMENTS, OR ANY OTHER ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS IN THESE OFFICIAL RULES, YOU ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO WIN A PRIZE. To be eligible to win a prize, entries must be completed and received by Sponsor in the manner and format designated below.
- **2. Contest Period:** The Contest starts at 12:00:01 a.m. Pacific Time (PT) on November 1, 2023 and ends at 11:59:59 p.m. (PT) on May 17, 2024 (the "*Contest Period*"). All entries must be received during the Contest Period and meet other requirements in these Official Rules to be eligible to win a prize. Sponsor's or its designee's computer is the official time-keeping device for the Contest.
- **3. How to Enter:** To enter, complete the following steps during the Contest Period:
- (1) Visit the <u>Art of Remembering: Student Art Contest webpage</u> and review the following background and prompt:

A. Background

1. It was 1944 and Henry Friedman was 15 years old. For 18 months, he had been hiding in the tiny cramped loft of a barn with his mother, brother and teacher, while the Nazis and their collaborators hunted every Jewish person. Finally, the Nazis fled, and it was safe for them to come out. Emaciated, starving, and having lost so much, Henry, along with his brother and parents were the only Jewish family from the city of Brody, Poland to survive the Holocaust. Now, 80 years later, on the anniversary of Henry's liberation, Henry continues to tell his story of surviving the Holocaust, owing his survival to the remarkable actions of Julia Symchuk, a non-Jewish teenage girl and her family that risked their own lives to hide him. Henry Friedman, whose story is one of many featured in our "Survivor Encyclopedia: Washington State", founded the Holocaust Center's art contest in honor of his father, Jacob, who instilled in Henry at a young age the importance of education. Through lessons of the Holocaust, we learn the importance of standing up for others, speaking out against hatred, and that each person can make a difference.

B. Prompt

 Choose one or more of the Holocaust survivor profiles from the "Survivor Encyclopedia: Washington State." In the art form of your choice, convey one local survivor story, or a piece of that story, which inspires or stands out to you. In your artist's statement of 125 words or less, tell us why you chose the story, image, or scene that you did.

C. Rules and Requirements

- 1. Art entries:
 - a. Must either be made by hand (paintings, drawings, prints, or film photography) or made using a computer (/with a computer program or photographs sent as a jpg, tiff, png, or other digital file).
 - b. Must include a description of your art piece (artist's statement), no more than 125 words.
 - c. Must be size 18"x24" or smaller and must be flat.
 - d. Cannot be sculpture or 3D art.
 - e. Should use fixatives if made with charcoal and pastel.
 - f. Must be submitted via mail/drop off at the Holocaust Center for Humanity or through the online entry form

C. Submission

- 1. Mail/Drop-off entry:
 - a. Submit by mail or drop off at the following address:

 - b. All entries that are mailed or dropped off must be clearly marked with the student's name, grade, and school. All entries that are mailed or dropped off must include a printed and filled out copy of our online entry form. Entries must be identifiable in case an HCH staff member has additional questions regarding the entry. Drop-offs must be coordinated with an HCH staff member.
- 2. Online Entry: Visit the 2024 Entry Submission Form and complete the online entry form, providing all requested information as well as a digital file of the art piece and the artist's statement. File can be of the digital art piece or a scan/photo of a handmade artwork. A scan/photo of a handmade artwork should be clear and well lit.
- 3. By submitting a piece as instructed through the above method ("Submission"), you agree that your Submission conforms to the Guidelines and Restrictions detailed below. Sponsor may choose to remove any Submission or disqualify you from the Contest if it believes that your Submission fails to conform with the Guidelines and Restrictions. Upon completion of entry steps and compliance with the Guidelines and Restrictions, you will automatically receive one entry into the Contest.

Entry Category: Depending on your grade, your Submission will be automatically entered into one of the following two entry categories as determined appropriate by Sponsor (each a separate "*Entry Category*"):

Grade 5-8 Art | Grade 9-12 Art

Submission Guidelines and Restrictions

- a. Your Submission must not supply untruthful, incomplete, inaccurate or misleading information.
- b. Your Submission must be your original creation and be owned 100% by you.
- **c.** Your Submission must not (in Sponsor's discretion): (i) violate any third-party rights, including copyrights, trademark rights, or rights of privacy and publicity; (ii) contain disparaging or defamatory statements;

- (iii) include threats to any person, place, business, or group; (iv) be obscene, offensive, or indecent; (v) depict any risky behavior; (vi) contain material that promotes bigotry, racism, hatred or harm against any group or individual or promotes discrimination based on race, gender, religion, nationality, disability, sexual orientation or age; and/or (vii) contain unauthorized third-party trademarks or logos.
- d. You represent and warrant that: (i) the Submission does not violate any applicable law, rule or regulation; (ii) to the extent the Submission depicts any real individual or features any other qualities of any real individual (apart from the local Holocaust survivor you selected from the Survivor Encyclopedia: Washington State), you are the individual pictured, heard, or otherwise featured in the Submission, or, alternatively, that you have obtained written permission from each person appearing in the entry to grant the rights to Sponsor described in these Official Rules, and will make written copies of such permissions available to Sponsor upon request; and (iii) the Submission complies with all requirements of these Official Rules.

If participating in this Contest via your mobile device (which service may only be available via select devices and participating wireless carriers, and is not required to enter), you may be charged for standard data use from your mobile device according to the terms in your wireless service provider's data plan. Normal airtime and carrier charges and other charges may apply to data use and will be billed on your wireless device bill or deducted from your pre-paid balance. Wireless carrier rates vary, so you should contact your wireless carrier for information on your specific data plan.

4. Identity of Entrant: All Submissions must be submitted by the individual entrant. Bulk or automated entries will be disqualified (including entries made using any script, macro, bot, or promotional service). Any attempt to obtain additional entries through fraud or other illegitimate means will result in disqualification, at Sponsor's discretion.

In the event of a dispute about the identity of the entrant using the online entry method, entries will be declared made by the authorized account holder of the email address submitted in connection with the Submission. An "authorized account holder" means the natural person who is assigned to an email address by an Internet access provider, online service provider or other organization (e.g., business, educational institution, etc.) that is responsible for assigning email addresses for the domain associated with the submitted email address.

Selection and Notification of Winner: On or around May 30, 2024, a panel of judges ("*Judges*") selected at Sponsor's discretion will each score each Submission based on the Judging Criteria (defined below).

"Judging Criteria":

- Adherence to Prompt (4 possible points per judge): Student clearly and powerfully illustrates/ conveys the prompt in their art: Convey one local survivor story which inspires or stands out to you.
- Originality/Creativity (4 possible points per judge): Work is highly original and creative. It clearly stands out from the other entries in its uniqueness.
- Artistic Merit (4 possible points per judge): There is excellent quality of artistry. Artist shows a great deal of age-appropriate talent and skill. It is obvious that a great deal of time and preparation went into making the work.
- Artist's Statement (not more than 100 words) (4 possible points per judge): There is a strong
 correspondence between the written statement and the visual image. Statement explains the art
 processes utilized, and/or the relevance to chosen survivor's story. Pieces lacking an artist's
 statement are disqualified before judges receive entries.

The Judges will add up the Judging Criteria scores received from each judge for each Submission to determine its total Judge's Score ("Judge's Score").

The three Submissions from each Entry Category that receive the highest Judge's Score will be selected as Finalists ("Finalists"). The Finalist's Submission with the highest score in each Entry Category will be selected as the First Place Winner. The Finalist's Submission with the second highest score in each Entry Category will be selected as the Second Place Winner. The Finalist's Submission with the third highest score in each Entry Category will be selected as the Third Place Winner. Additional Submissions from each Entry Category may be selected as Runners Up ("Runners Up"). In the event of a tie the Submission that received the higher Judge's Score in the criteria of "Artistic Merit" will be selected as the winner. Odds of winning a prize depend on the number and quality of eligible entries received.

Each potential winner will be notified via email, phone, or through their teacher on or before June 12, 2024. All prizes will be awarded in the name of the winner's parent or legal guardian on behalf of the winner. To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, Sponsor will require each potential winner and his/her parent or legal guardian to sign and return, within [seven] days of being notified, an Affidavit of Eligibility and Liability/Publicity Release in order to claim his/her/their prize. If (i) the attempted notification is returned as undeliverable without a forwarding address; (ii) any required documents are not returned within [seven] days, such as the Affidavit of Eligibility and Liability/Publicity Release; or (iii) if potential winner is otherwise unable to accept the prize as stated, the prize will be forfeited and will be awarded to the next highest scoring Submission in accordance with the Judging Criteria, subject to Sponsor's verification. Judging will occur until all prizes are awarded. If, by reason of a print or other error, more prizes are claimed than the number set forth in these Official Rules, the prize(s) will be awarded to the Finalist or Runner Up (as the case may be) with the highest scoring Submission in accordance with the Judging Criteria from among all eligible claimants making purportedly valid claims to award the prizes available.

<u>Verification of Potential Winner</u>: EACH POTENTIAL WINNER IS SUBJECT TO VERIFICATION BY SPONSOR, WHOSE DECISIONS ARE FINAL AND BINDING IN ALL MATTERS RELATED TO THE CONTEST. SPONSOR MAY DISQUALIFY SUBMISSIONS THAT ARE POTENTIALLY INFRINGING THIRD-PARTY RIGHTS. AN ENTRANT IS NOT A PRIZE WINNER UNLESS AND UNTIL ENTRANT'S ELIGIBILITY HAS BEEN VERIFIED AND ENTRANT HAS BEEN NOTIFIED THAT VERIFICATION IS COMPLETE AND NO FURTHER ACTION IS NEEDED.

5. Prize: The following prizes will be awarded:

<u>First Place Prize</u>: Two First Place Winners (one from each Entry Category) will receive a \$200 check, be invited to attend an award ceremony in Seattle, and have their Submission displayed on the Holocaust Center for Humanity website and in the Holocaust Center for Humanity.

<u>Second Place Prize</u>: Two Second Place Winners (one from each Entry Category) will receive a \$100 check, be invited to attend an award ceremony in Seattle, and have their Submission displayed on the Holocaust Center for Humanity website and in the Holocaust Center for Humanity.

<u>Third Place Prize</u>: Two Third Place Winners (one from each Entry Category) will receive a \$50 check, be invited to attend an award ceremony in Seattle, and have their Submission displayed on the Holocaust Center for Humanity website and in the Holocaust Center for Humanity.

<u>Runners Up</u>: Runners Up will each have their Submission displayed on the Holocaust Center for Humanity website and in the Holocaust Center for Humanity.

Total ARV of all prizes in the Contest: \$700

Prize Restrictions: ALL FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL TAXES ASSOCIATED WITH THE RECEIPT OR USE OF ANY PRIZE ARE THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE WINNER. Prizes are not transferable. No substitutions or exchanges of any prize (including for cash) will be permitted, except that Sponsor reserves the right to substitute a prize of comparable or greater value for any prize at Sponsor's discretion. Sponsor will not replace any lost or stolen prizes or prize components. Only the number of prizes stated in these Official Rules are available to be won in the Contest.

Except for applicable manufacturer's standard warranties, the prize is awarded "AS IS" and WITHOUT WARRANTY OF ANY KIND, express or implied (including any implied warranty of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose).

- **6. Disclaimer:** Sponsor and any of their parent companies, subsidiaries, affiliates, directors, officers, professional advisors, consultants, contractors, legal counsel, public relations firms, employees and advertising, fulfillment and marketing agencies (collectively, the "*Released Parties*") will not be responsible for: (a) any late, lost, misrouted, garbled or distorted or damaged transmissions or entries; (b) phone, electronic, hardware, software, network, Internet, or other computer or communications-related malfunctions or failures beyond Sponsor or the Released Parties' reasonable control; (c) any Contest disruptions, injuries, losses or damages caused by events beyond the reasonable control of Sponsor or the Released Parties by non-authorized human intervention; or (d) any printing or typographical errors in any materials associated with the Contest.

Limitations of Liability; Releases: By entering the Contest, you and your parent or legal guardian release Sponsor and all Released Parties from any liability whatsoever, and waive any and all causes of action, related to any claims, costs, injuries, losses, or damages of any kind arising out of or in connection with the Contest or delivery, misdelivery, acceptance, possession, use of, or inability to use any prize (including claims, costs, injuries, losses and damages related to rights of publicity or privacy, defamation or portrayal in a false light, whether intentional or unintentional), whether under a theory of contract, tort (including negligence), warranty or other theory.

TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY APPLICABLE LAW, IN NO EVENT WILL THE SPONSOR OR THE RELEASED PARTIES BE LIABLE FOR ANY SPECIAL, INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES, INCLUDING LOSS OF USE, LOSS OF PROFITS OR LOSS OF DATA, WHETHER IN AN ACTION IN CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE) OR OTHERWISE, ARISING OUT OF OR IN ANY WAY CONNECTED TO YOUR PARTICIPATION IN THE CONTEST OR USE OR INABILITY TO USE ANY EQUIPMENT PROVIDED FOR USE IN THE CONTEST OR ANY PRIZE, EVEN IF A RELEASED PARTY HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES.

Sponsor will have no obligation to publish, distribute, produce, use, sell, or retain any Submission.
