In this gentle, poetic young graphic novel, Dounia, a grandmother, tells her granddaughter the story even her son has never heard: how, as a young Jewish girl in Paris, she was hidden away from the Nazis by a series of neighbors and friends who risked their lives to keep her alive when her parents had been taken to concentration camps. (Fiction)	5
	<i>More Than Any Child Should Know</i> Thompson, Julia and Regelbrugge, Paul. <i>More Than Any Child Should Know</i> . Seattle, Holocaust Center for Humanity, 2021.	This true story follows eight-year-old Steve, a German-Jewish boy who escapes the Holocaust, traveling alone to find refuge in England and later the United States. Through Steve's eyes, readers witness history's turmoil, the costs of war and bigotry, and the enduring strength of hope and resilience. (Nonfiction)	5
	<i>The Mule Cart: An Armenian Refugee Family's Escape</i> Cort, Arpie Cherchian Cort and Cort, David Louis. <i>The Mule Cart: An Armenian Refugee Family's Escape</i> . Redmond, Fig Mint Press, 2025.	Inspired by true stories from the Armenian genocide, a little girl named Anoosh and her family climb aboard a mule cart and leave everything behind. As they travel from Aintab to Aleppo, Anoosh finds courage in her mother's songs, comfort in the familiar taste of lavash and pickles, and glimmers of hope in swallows, stars, and a gray mule. 	<i>Refugee: The Graphic Novel</i> Gratz, Alan. <i>Refugee</i>. Graphix, 2025	Three intertwined stories follow young people fleeing war and persecution. Josef escapes Nazi Germany on the <i>St. Louis</i>, only to be turned back to Europe. Isabel flees Cuba on a raft during the 1990s exodus. Mahmoud escapes war-torn Syria, crossing the Aegean Sea in search of safety. Each story reveals hardship, courage, and the enduring strength of love and family. (Fiction)	5
	<i>Terrible Things: An Allegory of the Holocaust</i> Bunting, Eve, 1928-. <i>Terrible Things : An Allegory of the Holocaust</i>. Philadelphia :Jewish Publication Society, 1989.	This unique introduction to the Holocaust encourages young children to stand up for what they think is right, without waiting for others to join them. <i>Terrible Things</i> tells the story of a young rabbit who watches as the "terrible things" swoop in and take away different groups of animals living in the forest, until the rabbits are last to remain. (Fiction)	5
	<i>We Are Not Strangers</i> Tuininga, Josh. <i>We Are Not Strangers</i>. New York, Harry N. Abrams, 2023.	This graphic novel, inspired by true events, tells the story of a Jewish immigrant striving to help his Japanese neighbors during their incarceration in World War II. It poignantly portrays a community's struggle with race, responsibility, and the essence of being American. (Fiction)	5
	<i>White Bird: A Wonder Story</i> Palacio, R. J. <i>White Bird: A Wonder Story</i>. New York, Alfred A. Knopf, 2019.	In R. J. Palacio's <i>Auggie & Me</i>, which expands on characters in <i>Wonder</i>, readers were introduced to Julian's grandmother, Grandmère. Here, Palacio makes her graphic novel debut with Grandmère's heartrending story: how she, a young Jewish girl, was hidden by a family in a Nazi-occupied French village during World War II; how the boy she and her classmates once shunned became her savior and best friend. (Fiction)	5

	Pájaro blanco Pájaro blanco Palacio, R.J. <i>Pájaro blanco</i>. Barcelona: Nube de Tinta, 2020.	En esta historia, la abuela de Julian cuenta cómo, siendo niña judía llamada Sara, fue acogida por una familia en un pueblo francés ocupado por los nazis. Allí, el niño al que todos rechazaban se convirtió en su salvador y mejor amigo. 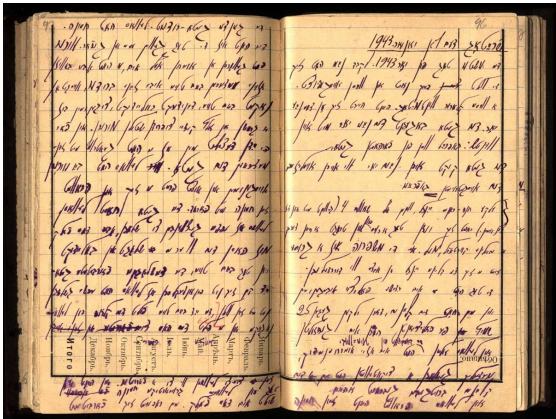
